Chinese Currency Revaluation: What Impact will it have on Global Trade?

In the last decade, China's exchange rate policy of their currency, the yuan, versus the U.S. dollar has been widely criticized by U.S. politicians and business interests. Critics have claimed the Chinese government's undervaluation of the yuan, which is pegged by the Chinese government to a basket of currencies and does not trade openly in global currency markets like most other major world currencies, has created a competitive advantage for Chinese products on the global trade markets and has resulted in the large US-China trade imbalance.

On June 19th, China responded to exchange rate concerns by announcing that they would allow greater flexibility in the value of the yuan, which was seen as the clearest sign yet that China would allow its currency to appreciate against the dollar. President Obama praised China's action stating, "China's decision to increase the flexibility of its exchange rate is a constructive step that can help safeguard the recovery and contribute to a more balanced global economy." Only time will tell how aggressively the Chinese government will bump the value of their currency relative to other global currencies.

Many pundits have assumed that the revaluation will result in increased manufacturing output and thus reduce the U.S. trade deficit with China. While greater buying power from the Chinese may slightly benefit U.S. manufacturers, the presumption that an appreciating yuan will have a substantial impact on U.S. exports is wishful thinking. Although the U.S. has lost an estimated 1.3 million manufacturing jobs to China over the past 10 years, primarily due to cheaper labor cost, the undervalued yuan is not the sole culprit. Since 2005, the yuan has appreciated 20% relative to the dollar. During that time, the U.S. – China trade imbalance has not decreased appreciably, and China's growth has not suffered as a result of more expensive imports.

Although many U.S. politicians and businesses believe a stronger yuan would fix the U.S. – China trade imbalance by making U.S. exports cheaper and Chinese imports more expensive, merely revaluating the yuan will not solve the U.S. global trade imbalance. As long as Americans continue to be net consumers there will be a trade deficit, if not with China then with another low-cost, low-wage manufacturing country. Any gains from China trade will be offset by increased imbalance with those other countries.
